



# **Age groups: population and percent share by sex** 2021 Population - Housing Census




















#### Main aggregates of General Government as percentage of GDP




### Expenditure of General Government as percentage of GDP







### Annual rates of change (%)





#### Euro area countries: HICP. Annual average rate of change (%), 2023






### **Euro area countries: General Government** deficit/surplus as a percentage of GDP, 2023




















### Dispatches - Exports (in bil. €)





#### Population aged 15 years and over by employment status





#### Persons employed aged 15 years and over by main sector of the economy








#### Unemployment rate (%) in euro area countries, 2023




#### Percentage distribution of average monthly expenditure (purchases) on food, 2022




#### Housing amenities of households (%), 2022






## Euro area countries: People at-risk-of-poverty or social exclusion (%), 2023







#### Pupils per teacher (general upper secondary schools)




#### Students: technical sector - universities






