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



# **Age groups: population and percent share by sex** 2021 Population - Housing Census





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



2021 Population - Housing Census





### Percentage distribution of households by size





Total mortality rate: the number of deaths per 1,000 people.

Infant mortality rate: the number of children dying at less than 1 year of age divided by the number of live births that year. The ratio is expressed by 1,000 live births.










### Main aggregates of General Government as percentage of GDP




### Expenditure of General Government as percentage of GDP




























#### Dispatches - Exports (in bil. €)





### Population aged 15 years and over by employment status





### Persons employed aged 15 years and over by main sector of the economy








### Unemployment rate (%) in euro area countries, 2023


### Percentage distribution of average monthly household expenditure (purchases) on goods and services, 2023


#### Percentage distribution of average monthly expenditure (purchases) on food, 2023








### Euro area countries: People at-risk-of-poverty or social exclusion (%), 2023





### Pupils per teacher (lower secondary schools)



#### Pupils per teacher (general upper secondary schools)




#### Students: technical sector - universities





# Percentage distribution of nights spent by residents and non residents in hotels except campsites, 2023












