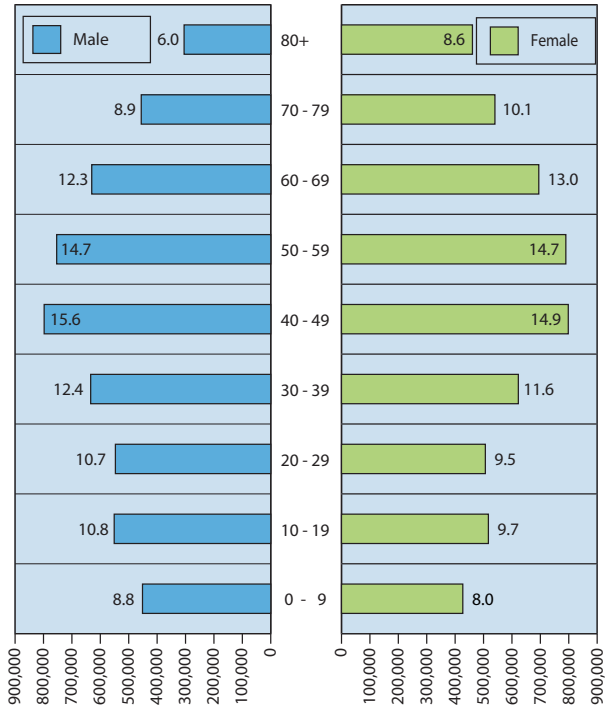

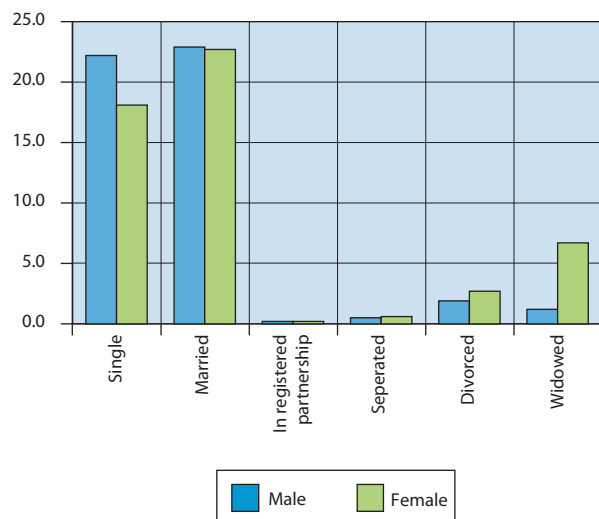

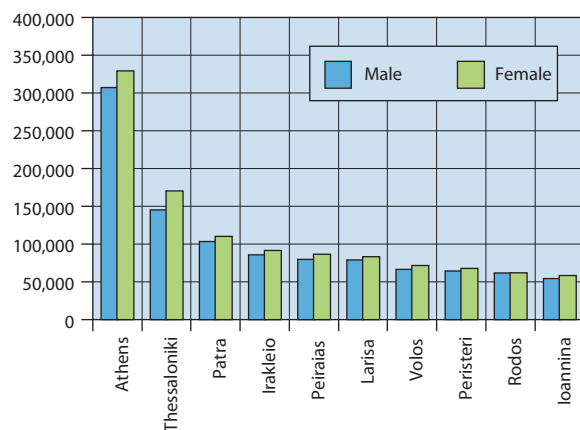

2021 Population - Housing Census



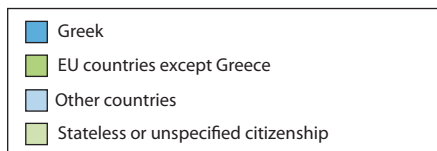
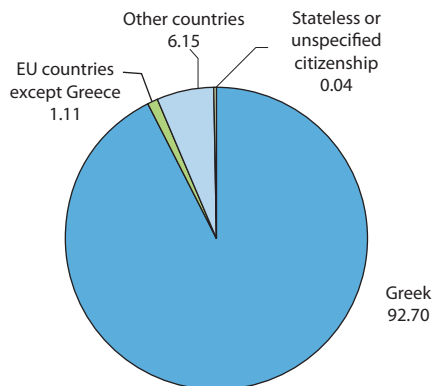

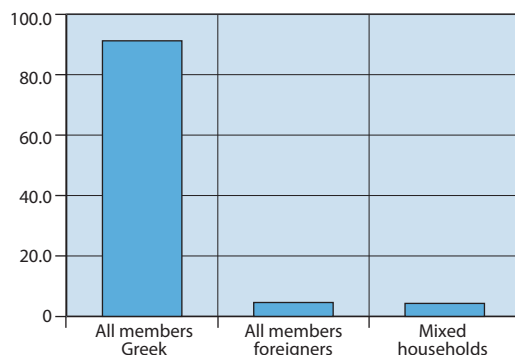
### Percentage distribution of households by size 2021 Population - Housing Census

Total mortality rate: the number of deaths per 1,000 people.

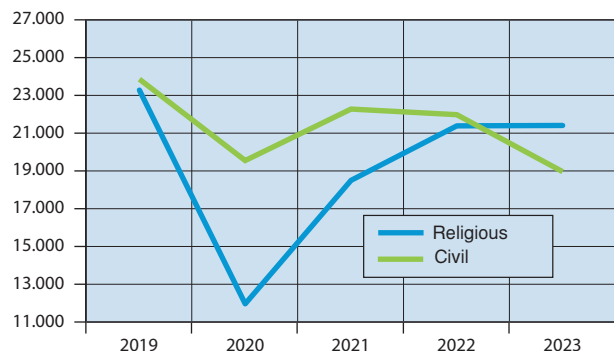
Infant mortality rate: the number of children dying at less than 1 year of age divided by the number of live births that year. The ratio is expressed by 1,000 live births.

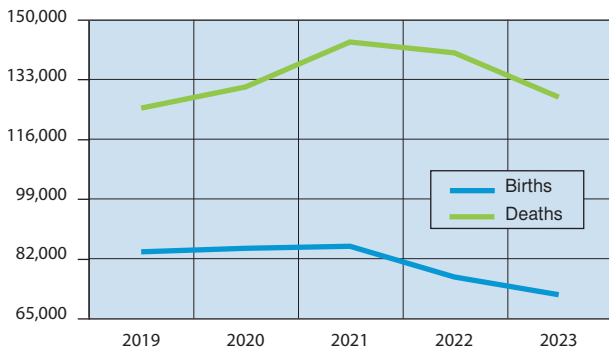
**Marriages by type**

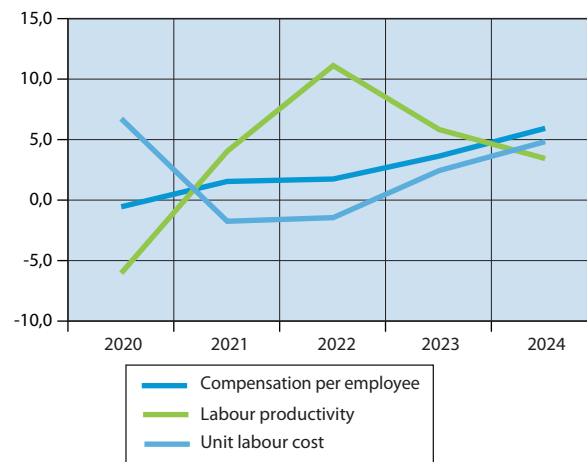

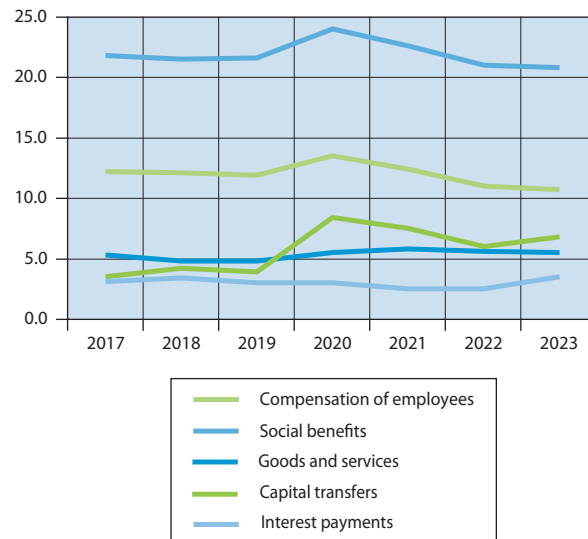

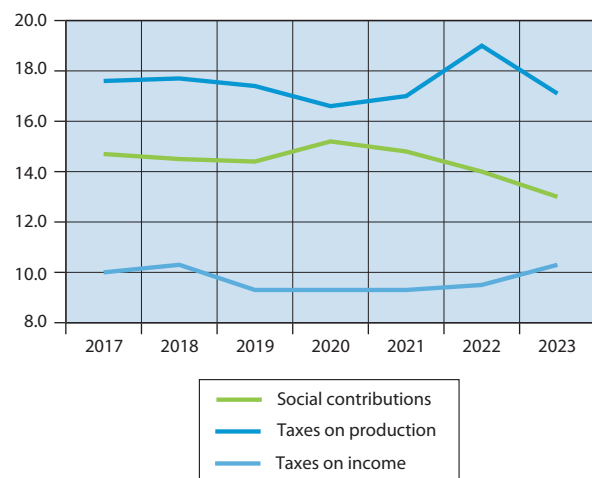
Main aggregates of General Government as percentage of GDP



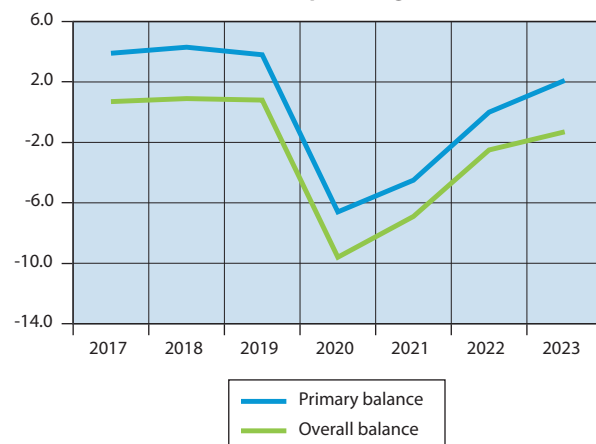
Expenditure of General Government as percentage of GDP

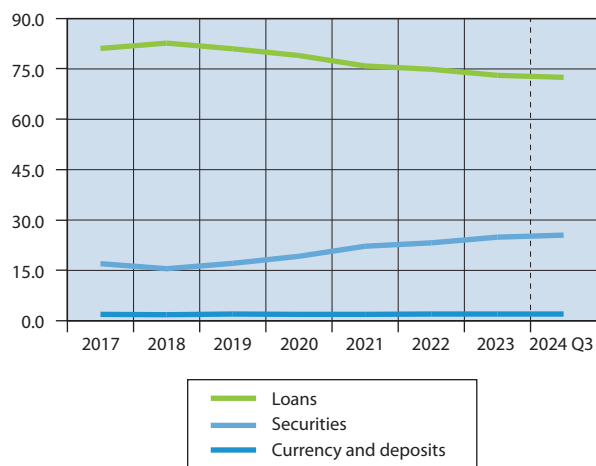

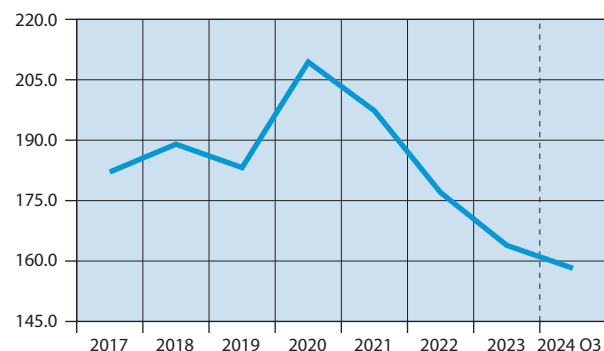

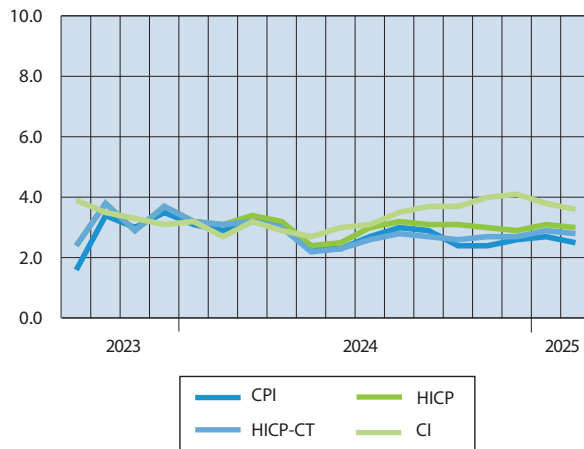

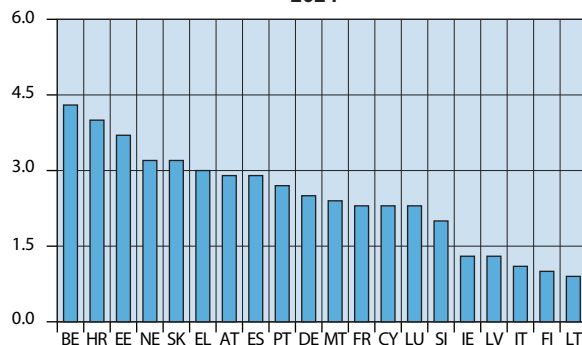

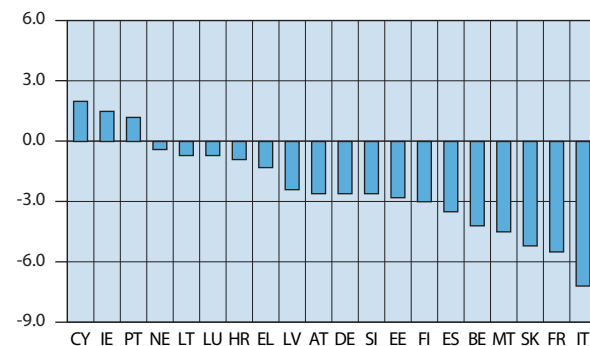

**Euro area countries: General Government deficit/surplus as a percentage of GDP, 2023**


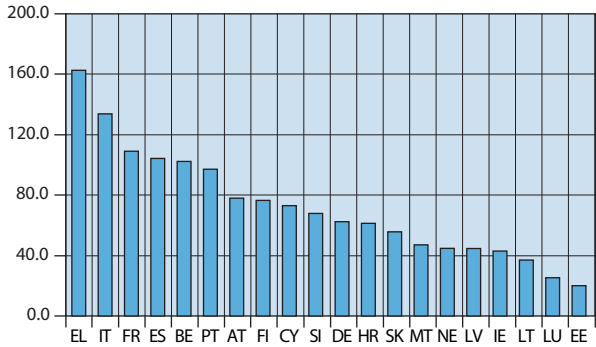

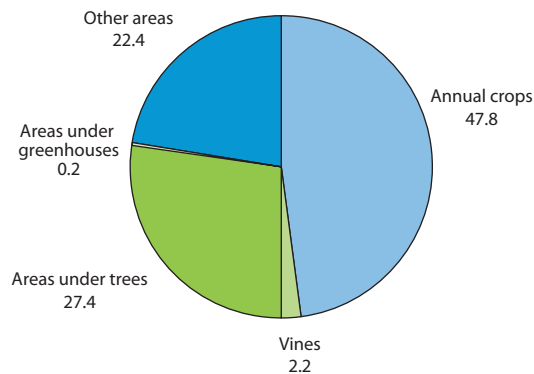

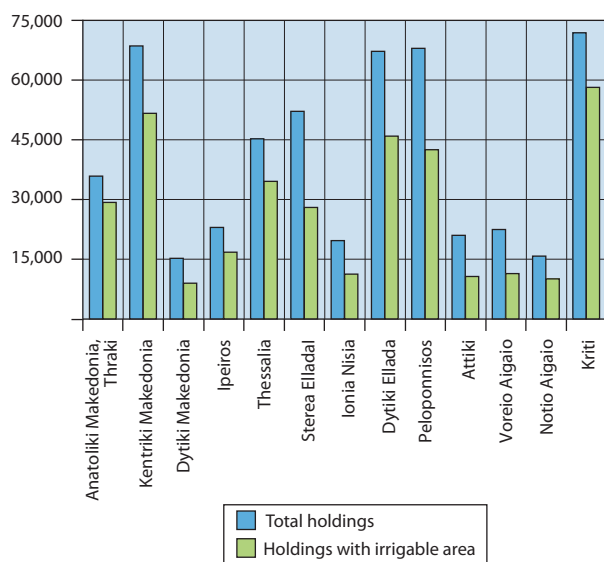

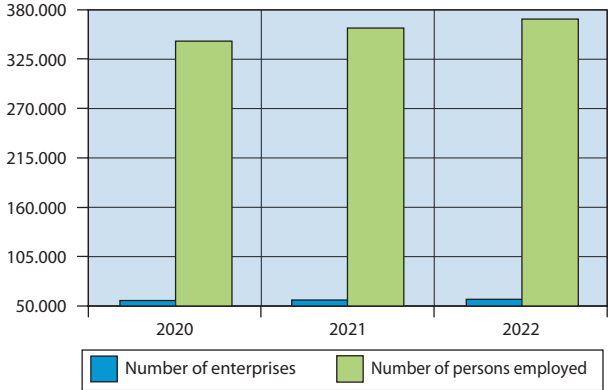

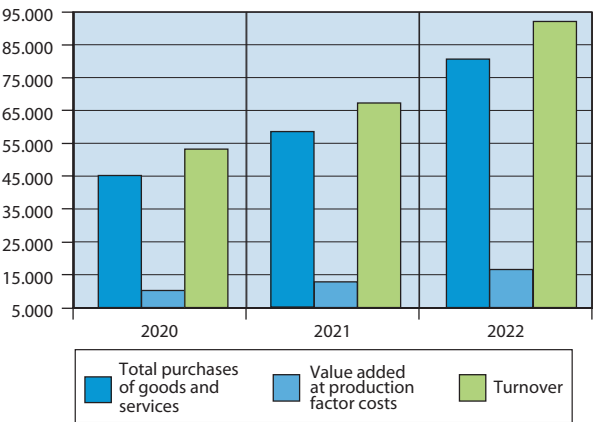

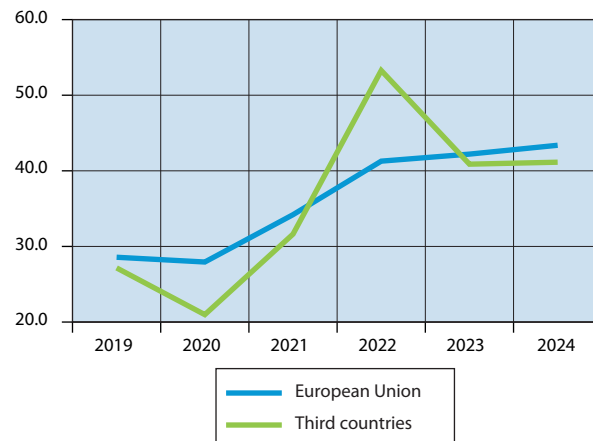

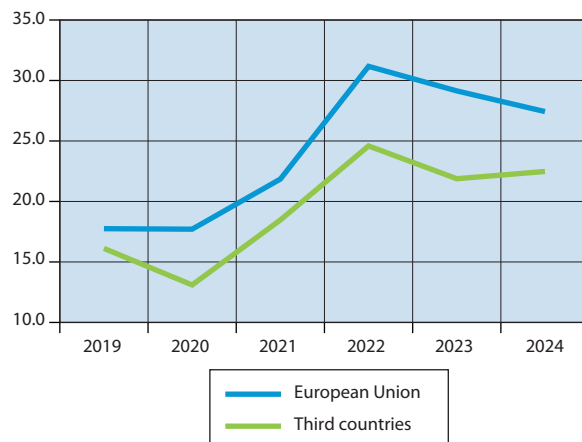

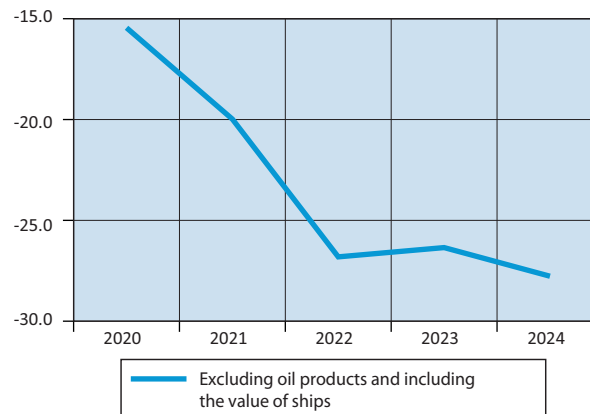
### Arrivals - Imports (in bil. €)

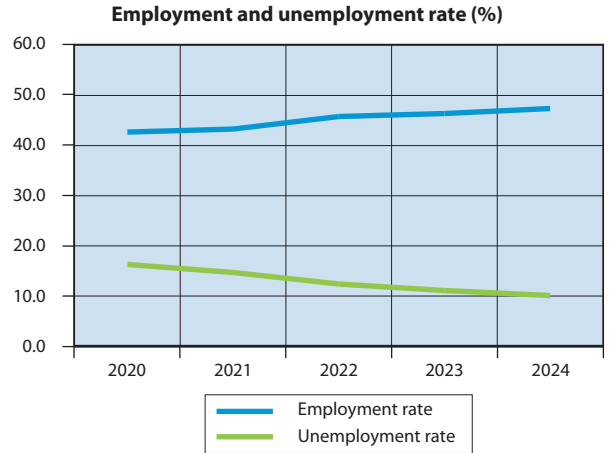

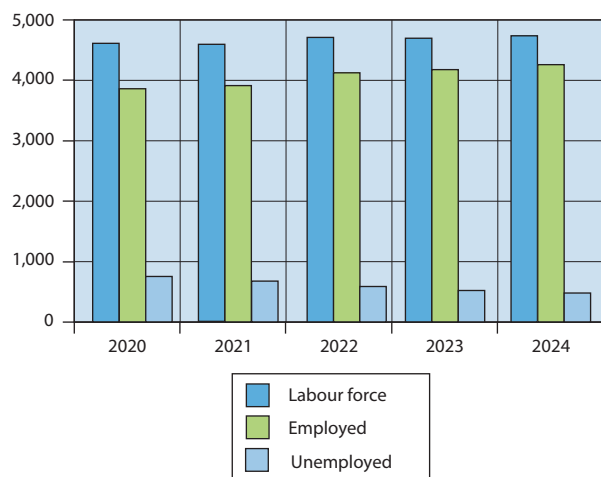

Population aged 15 years and over by employment status

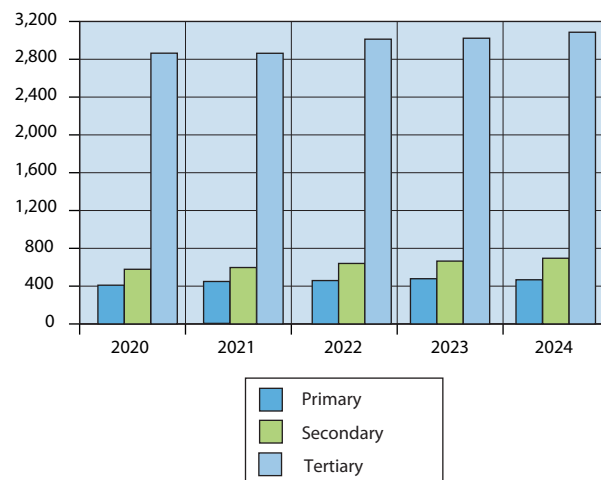

Persons employed aged 15 years and over by main sector of the economy

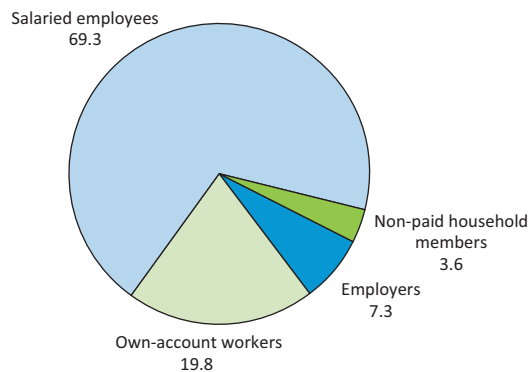

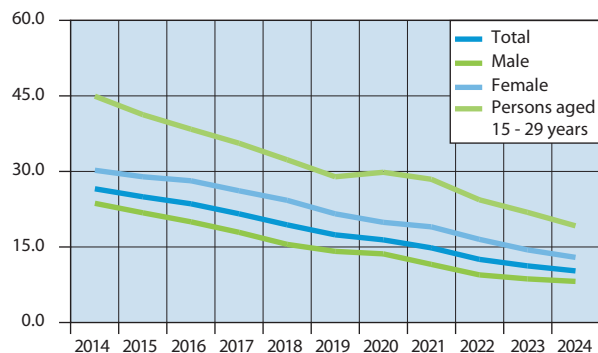

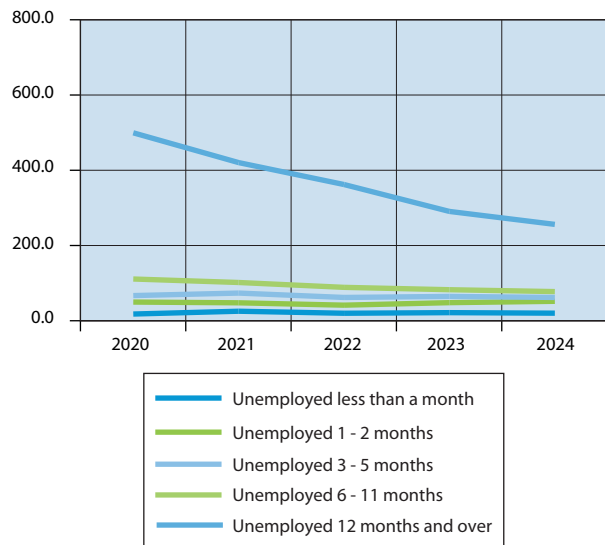

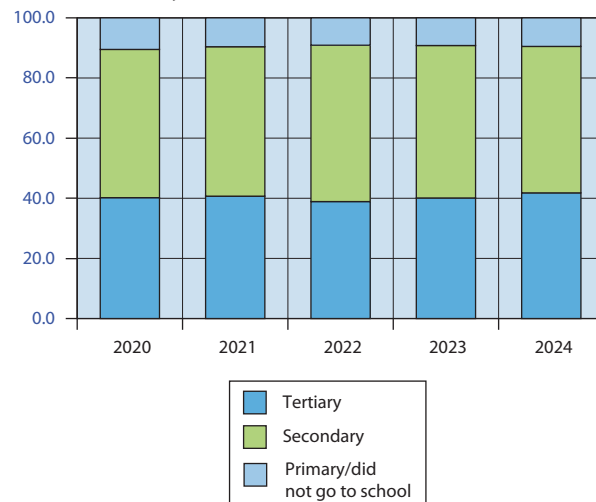

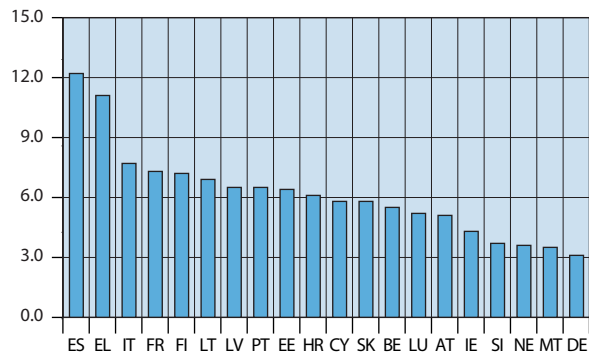

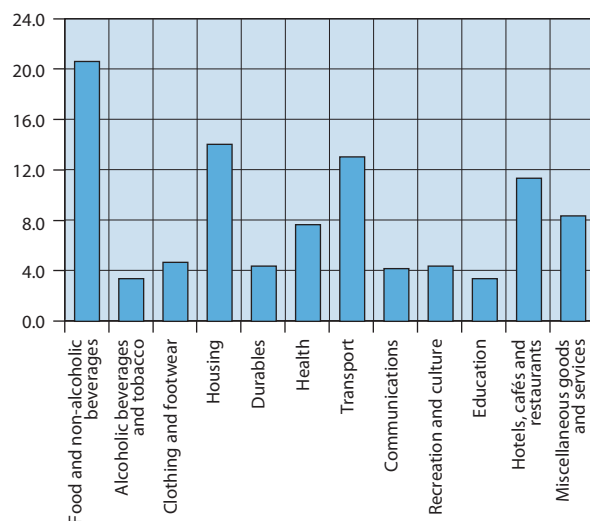

**Percentage distribution of average monthly household expenditure (purchases) on goods and services, 2023**

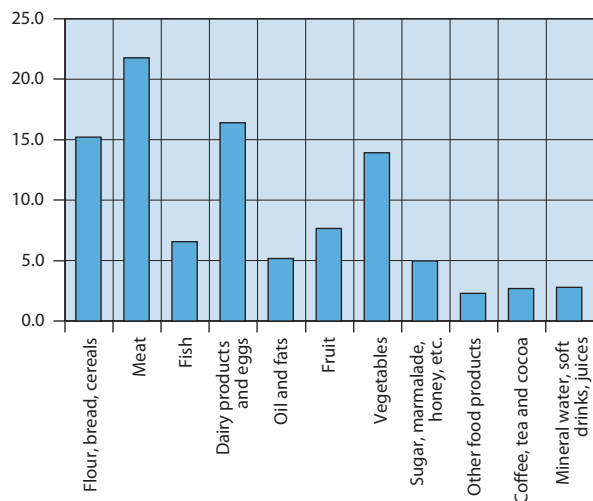

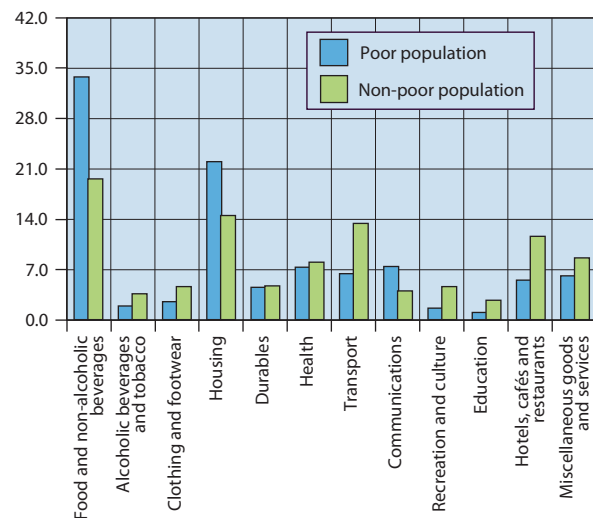

**Percentage distribution of average monthly purchases by poverty status, 2023**



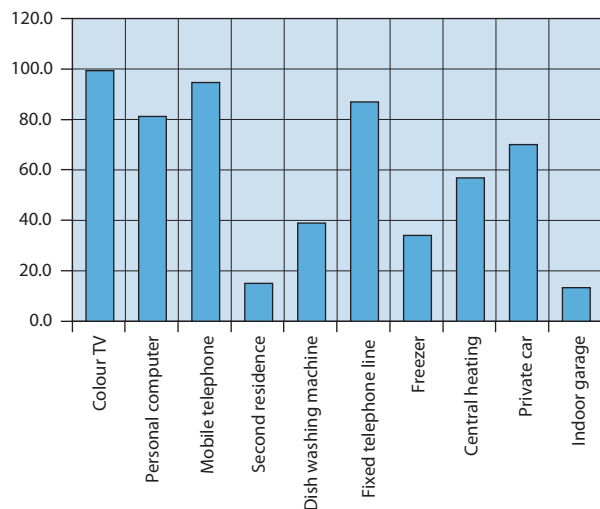

Housing amenities of households (%), 2023



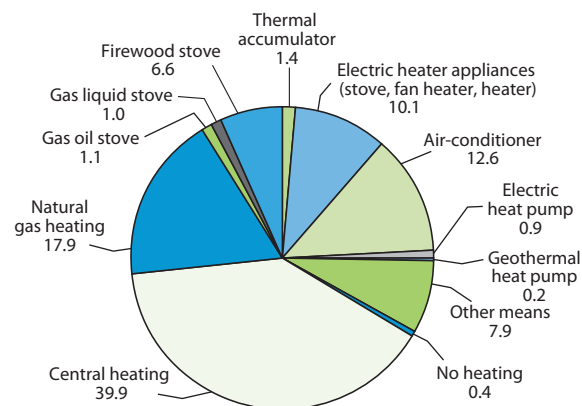

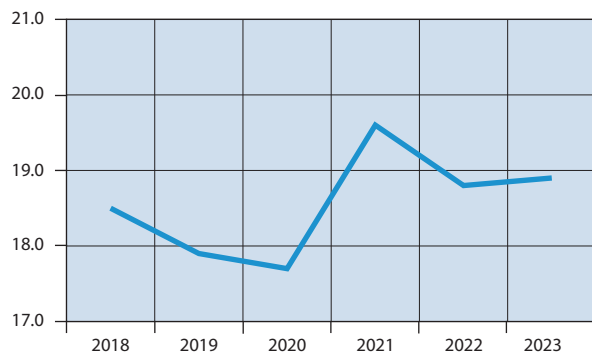

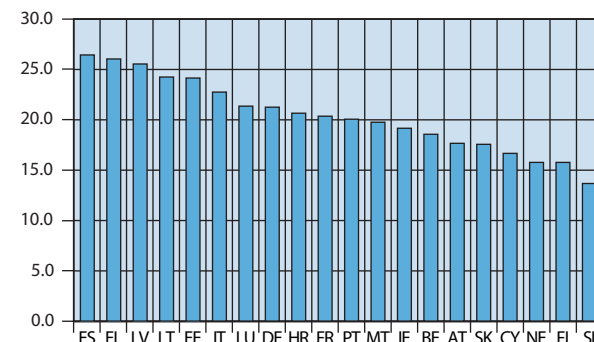

#### Euro area countries: People at-risk-of-poverty or social exclusion (%), 2023



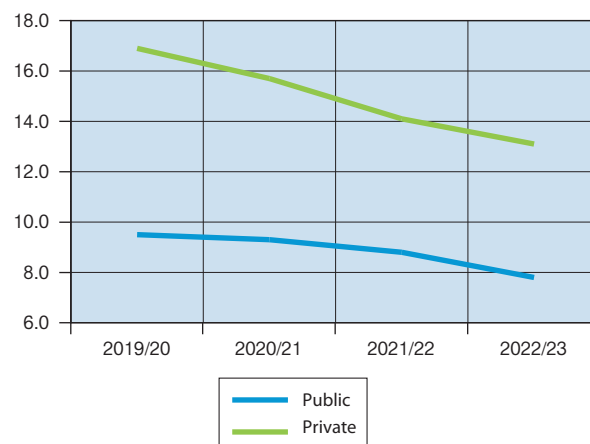

**Pupils per kindergartner (kindergartens)**


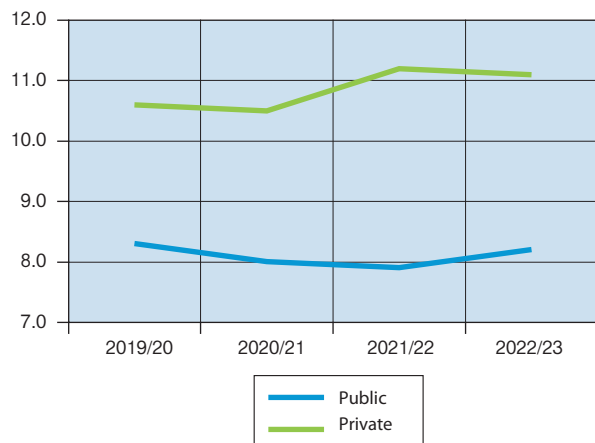

Pupils per teacher (primary schools)



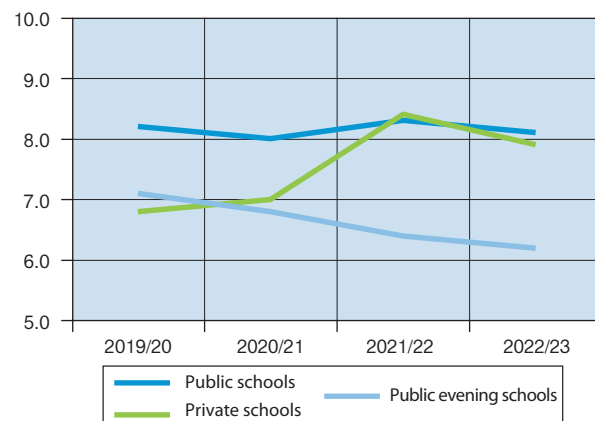

Pupils per teacher (lower secondary schools)

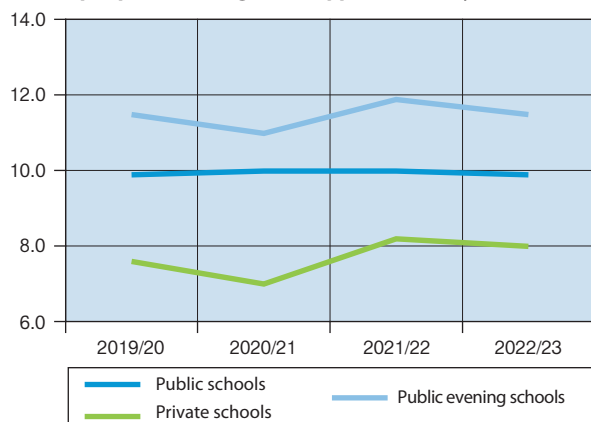

Pupils per teacher (general upper secondary schools)

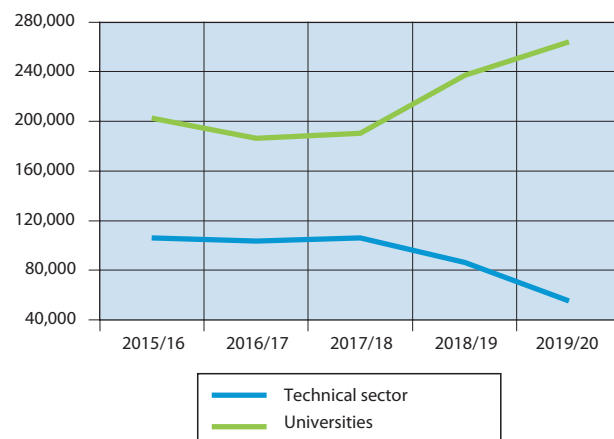

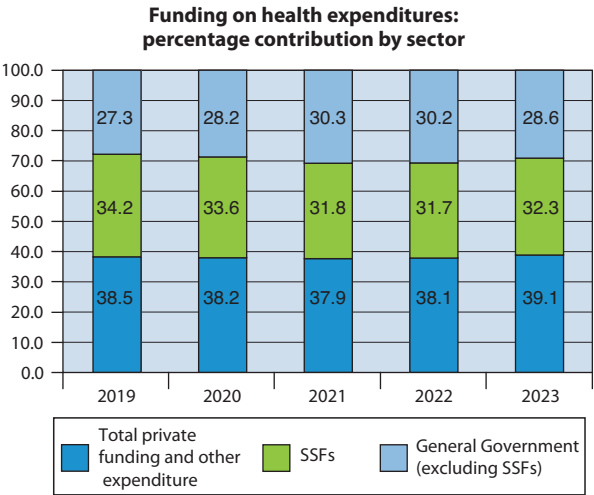

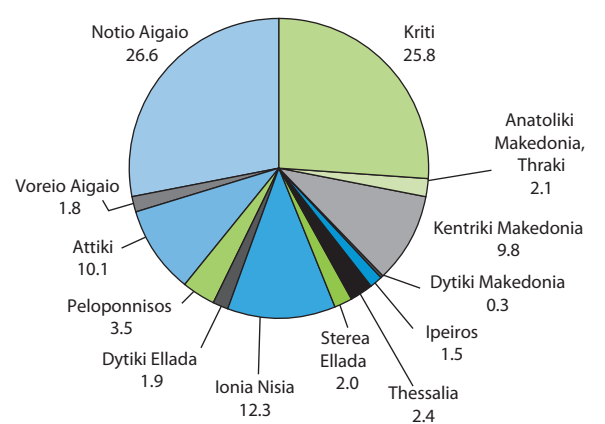

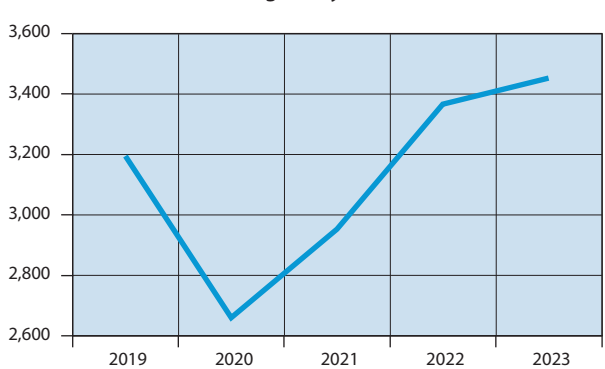

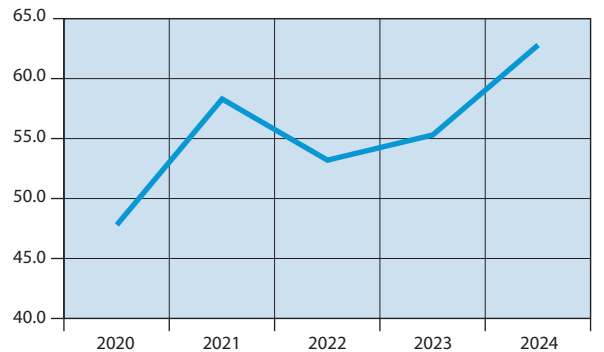

Percentage of population having used the internet and bought / ordered goods or services over the internet

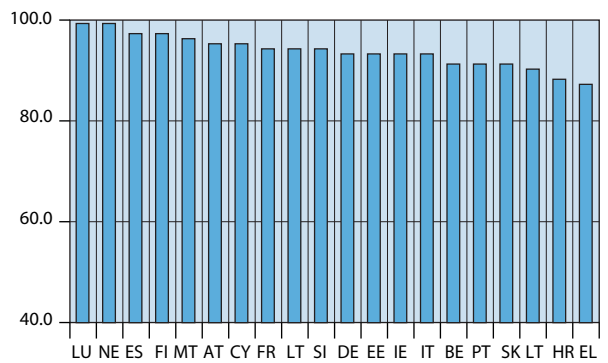
